In recognition of the importance of good quality waterproof membranes two Australian standards associated with External Waterproof Membranes have been published with a view to having them called up in the 2013 edition of the Building Code of Australia. With the use of industry experts this DVD will describe the requirements of the relevant Australian standards and demonstrate good practice construction techniques that minimise the likelihood of defects occurring.
